II. What Prayer Is Not

1. Prayer is not merely repeating words without thought to God.

Matthew 6:7. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words.

2. Prayer is not in the number of words said to God.

Mark 12:40. They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely.

- 3. Prayer is not limited to asking God for things. Here are seven different types of prayer.
 - a. Prayer of praise and worship—Hebrews 13:15 and Revelation 4:11
 - Hebrews 13:15. Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that openly profess his name.
 - Revelation 4:11. You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being.

 - b. **1 Thessalonians. 5:17.** "pray without ceasing." This does not mean that we should pray non-stop, which would be impossible. The idea is, keep coming back to prayer repeatedly, all throughout the day.
- 9. Pray thankfully.
 - a. **Psalm 86:12**. I will give thanks to You, O Lord my God, with all my heart.
 - Right after telling us to pray without ceasing, the Apostle Paul says in 1 Thessalonians. 5:18, "in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
- 10. Pray in humility. David's prayer is permeated with humility.
 - a. He prays, for God to be gracious to him, **Psalm 86:3, 16**—have mercy on me, Lord; Turn to me and have mercy on me.
 - b. He refers to himself as God's servant, the son of His handmaid,

 Psalm 86:2, 4—Save your servant who trusts in you. Bring joy to
 your servant, Lord, for I put my trust in you.
